Tori Huster, a Cincinnati native, is the current president of the National Women's Soccer League Players Association, elected in 2020. She spent 11 seasons with the Washington Spirit, including the inaugural season of the National Women's Soccer League in 2013, and also played professionally for Australia's Newcastle Jets and Western Sydney Wanderers. An advocate for livable wages, players' rights, and worker protections, Huster has played a crucial role in collective bargaining with the NWSLPA. Under Huster's leadership in 2022, the players made history by signing the first ever CBA in US pro women's soccer history. She recently retired from professional soccer in December 2023 and continued working to secure more player freedoms and even higher minimum standards in the newly signed CBA in August 2024.
